## Play with...

2-4 players, age 5 and up.

## What's in the Box?

48 number cards ( 6 cards of each number from 1-8).


## General Description:

The game is played in 8 rounds. In each round the objective of the game is to complete a row of face-up cards in ascending number order. The player who completes his/her row - with the face-up cards in their appropriate location (ascending number order) advances to the next step in the next round. In the next round this player's row will be shorter by one card. Thus in the first step a complete row goes from 1 to 8 , in the second step the number of cards goes from 1 to 7 , in the third from to 1 to 6 , etc. In the last step a player begins with one card and must get a frog card or the card with the number 1.

## How to Play?

Shuffle the cards and deal 8 cards to each player. The players arrange their cards in a face-down row without looking at them. Place the remainder of the cards face-down as a draw pile.


The youngest player goes first and draws a card from the draw pile. If the player draws a garbage card it is discarded face-up next to the draw pile, starting a garbage pile - ending this player's turn. If the player draws a number card or a frog card, the player places it in the appropriate location in his/her row of cards. To make room for the new card the player must remove the face-down card that occupies this space. The player checks the removed card, and if it is a number card or a frog card, moves it to its appropriate location and removes the face-down card which occupies this space. The player may keep moving cards to their appropriate location as long as the exposed cards in the row can be replaced. This player's turn ends when a garbage card or a number card that is already placed face-up in its location is exposed. The card which the player could not place in the row is discarded face-up next to the draw pile, starting a garbage pile - ending the player's turn. The following players in turn - going clockwise - play the same way, but they
may choose to take the top card from the garbage pile or to draw a card from the draw pile.


## Frog Cards

Frog cards are wild cards and can stand for any number. A player may move a frog card to a new location and replace it with a number card which the frog represented.

## Garbage Cards

The shoe, can, bottle and apple are garbage cards. In addition, all the number cards that are higher than the highest number in a player's row become garbage cards for that player. A player who draws or exposes a garbage card discards it to the garbage pile, ending this player's turn.

## The End of a Round

A player that completes his/her row ends the round and proceeds to the next step in the next round. All the other players are entitled to one more turn, and players who succeed in completing their row join the winner and also proceed to the next round.

## Last Chance

Before collecting all the cards and beginning the next round all players who did not make it in this round get another chance: They expose their face-down cards in their row and those who are lucky to have the face-down cards already in the right location also proceed to the next round.

## Next Round

The round ends when all the cards are exposed. Collect all the cards, shuffle them and deal each player the number of cards according to the player's level (the number of cards in a row). The player who won the previous round starts the new round.

## Ending the Game

The game ends when one (or more) of the players completes their final round - in which the player started out with one card and managed to replace it with a card with the number 1 or with a frog. This player is the winner. If more than one player wins the last round then the game ends in a tie.

## Long Game

For a longer game, players may decide that after the game ends with a winner or a tie they start from their final number of cards when the game ended. This time they begin to climb/ascend all the way up until one or more of the players completes a row of 8 cards again.
