

Game Rules

Playing with...

2 to 4 participants aged 6 and up.

What's in the box?

20 colored cups, 36 task cards, a bell, game instructions.

General description

The task cards always feature five items in blue, red, green, yellow, and black. Each round, you must look at the task card placed in the center and arrange your cups according to the arrangement of the items on the card. On some cards, the arrangement is horizontal, and then you need to place the cups in a row side by side, on some it's vertical, and then you need to stack the cups one on top of the other, and on some, the arrangement of cups is a Combo of both. The player who completes the task accurately and rings the bell first wins the card.


Getting ready

Place the bell in the center. Shuffle the cards and place them face-down next to the bell. Distribute 5 cups to each participant - one of each color. Put the remaining cups in the box. Each player places their five cups in front of them in a row, side by side.

How to play

The oldest player draws a card and quickly places it in the center for everyone to see, and all the players rush to arrange their cups according to the task on the card. Every player who completes the task must ring the bell. The player who rings first and completes the cup arrangement accurately, wins the card. However, if they make a mistake, they are disqualified, and the card goes to the next player (provided they are accurate of course) and so on. The player who wins a card keeps it by their side until the end of the game.

Important note: In the horizontal arrangement, it does not matter if you arrange the cups from left to right or from right to left (as long as the colors are in the correct order). In the vertical and Combo arrangement, orientation is important (which is on top and which is at the bottom.)



A round ends, a new round begins...

The game can be played in two difficulty levels. It's recommended to start with the beginner version and then move on to the advanced version.

Beginner version: At the end of each round, everyone rearranges their cups in a row, and when ready, another card is drawn.

Advanced version: At the end of each round, the cups remain in the arrangement from the last card played, and this is the starting point for the next round. Before starting the new round, make sure everyone completed the task from the last card, so everyone starts from the same place.

And who's the winner?

The game ends after all 36 task cards have been played, and the player who has the most cards is the winner!

Practice is the key to success!

Note: Speed Cups is a game of concentration, quick decision-making, and nimble hands.

Play it again and again and discover how practice is the key to success and excellence.

Tips:

- Think before you act. Pay attention to whether the arrangement on the card is horizontal, vertical or Combo.
- Don't panic. Quick thinking is as important as quick hands.
- Try to use both hands.
